

Where we reached in 2021

Kipepeo Family Foundation has impacted 33 families from 5 different communities.

We are thankful for all we have achieved and look forward to all upcoming work. Glad to be allowed being part of the social development in Tanzania we appreciate you, acknowledging us.

It is a privilege that many village leaders around Kilimanjaro Region and as well the Social Welfare Department of the Moshi Municipal trusts in our NGO.

About education issues:

This year we have helped 20 different children in order to sign up for, attend or continue with their education. We are having two Types of educational support.

Type A: We support someone's child until the parent-/s is self-dependent and will take over this part again. That support usually is given once or twice, either for a period of one or two school-semester.

Type B: Some parent-/s, despite our help, are not able to reach complete self-responsibility nor can they be responsible for all basic needs of their children. Education for the child is needed in order to grow out of poverty. This year we have committed to be fully responsible of 5 children. We will come up for any school issue, material and fees upcoming, until they are fully graduated and able to earn their own money. The parent-/s part is it to take over the cost and care for the other basic needs such as : a home, food, safety, clothes, health issues and care.

Families:

Underneath listed are the activities we did in each family attending in 2021.

Lidness got equipment to work her stones with more safety as before. Also we increased her capital of stones so that her business of cracking and selling them can get more beneficial.

Joseph has received help of us by cleaning his farm and forest on which he can now help his grandfather growing vegetables, coffee and banana trees. As well he got three pigs and food for them for three months. The idea is that after this three month he will have a small income from the farmed vegetables and fruits which he can reuse into the food for the pigs. The pigs he can increase on his own, breed and sell them either as an animal or for meat reasons to someone living in the same village or further to town.

Mwinji coming from living part time on the street and attending a Street children outreach centre where they did arts crafts he has experience in connecting with other people and selling goods. We helped him starting a business in which he walks around town with a wheelbarrow, selling sandals to potential customers.

Arnold got a special deal of Kipepeo Family Foundation. As an organisation we decided to provide 1-2 motorcycles each year to people in need to the community. Arnold is our first trial person. He is a father of 2 children, living together with his wife. Their home burn down and Arnold lost all he had. He is good in repairing motorcycles and assists in a nearby garage. He

is able to drive motorcycles too and agreed to go for the deal we made: He will get the motorcycle, paid by Kipepeo if he then, every day for a period of 10 Month pays 10,000tsh back to us in order to return the full amount of invested money. On this way we will be able to reuse that amount for another person in need, which would like to earn his money by driving people around on a motorcycle. → This is an official transport way in Tanzania, used by many travellers and locals :) Arnold's daughter Salma got help for signing up at school and the payment for school fees and items for one year (Type A)

Restituta is dealing with an alcohol addiction. Her husband and their two daughters suffer under it in different ways. The first step was to make the environment safe. Kipepeo has helped the family to renovate the room they live in which was falling apart. As well we made sure the younger child gets its birth certificate and can now sign up for and start primary school (Type A). Further solutions on how the family could solve the source of their poverty and on how they could get self-depending again will be discussed.

Bibi Ekram her grandson got one-time emergency help for the annual school fees and some school items. (Type A)

Khadija was enabled to sell vegetables at the Mbuyuni market in town. Her daughter helps her to get the vegetables and Khadija sells them because she knows well about business. The reason why she stopped was her heart problem which makes it impossible for her to walk far distances especially in the heat. She also has an open skull due to a fit of rage her husband had. Since that day she is alone living with daughters of different families, getting love and daily help from them but also in need of providing food, healthcare and education for them in return. A contribution to the depths of her house rent was made. Two of her daughters got educational help (Type A)

Simon used to sit next to the roads in Moshi town, begging people for money. He did since he lost one of his legs due to an accident. We contributed for him to get an artificial leg. That will ease him to manage his daily life and work for a valuable job. His wish would be to have the equipment for being a cobbler (shoemaker).

Yassinta Joseph Chami is a widow, having aids and not in a condition where she can work well anymore. We included another organization that provides now food to her regularly. We from Kipepeo brought her a bed and mattress to sleep on and she sleeps in a small room, given by a neighbor.

Margreth Mushi lost her husband due to a sickness and could not keep her work up anymore due to the fact that she had to care for all of their four children alone all on a sudden. Trough Kipepeo could the school fees of this year get paid for her children, so that they could continue with their education and solutions be found on how they can live while Margret works. (Type A) Trough that Margret had an idea and some experience with selling clothes already we helped her financial with starting a clothes business. She is now in the process of learning how to get profit of, while reinvesting the money in new clothes and increase her income on this way.

Leokadia is planting rice and cleaned her field for it with the financial support of Kipepeo Family Foundation.

Elias is right now harvesting the vegetables which he planted two month ago. He had the knowledge of doing agriculture and we empowered him by helping practical to clean and prepare the farm he had as well as financing the seeds for the first plantation. Now he will sell the vegetables in his village and plant new ones out of the profit.

Emmanuel Chindza got one time support to finish his studies at university. There was an issue in his family which was not solvable in a sudden way. (Type A)

Inovacity Mshana lost his leg on an accident. Since that day he lost his job, the ability to come up for all the costs of his family and the issues of poverty have set in. Luckily they have their own land on which we could build a chicken house and supported the family with a chicken-business start-up.

Haikaeli Latayo was empowered to have a small shop in her village which will provide enough income for her family and their basic needs.

Debora Songoi is a Masai. She recieved three goats which will be a profit in different ways to the family. They are using the goat milk to cook tee for breakfast and also to eat with their traditional mais-meal instead of having vegetables.

Gladness Sendeka is a Masai. As it is a common way to support, she did get two goats too for her, in order to start farming with them. By increasing the amount of animals she will be able making business out of it which helps her family to depend on her. Since Gladness should be home for her children and her husband has issues with alcohol this is s more or less safe way of having a potential income.

Morgan's Child we support since Morgan have died in March 2021. Morgan was the main Leader of PTWBGC- a NGO we collaborate with in Moshi; Tanzania. We agreed to take over the educational responsibility of his only son. (Type B)

Irene has gotten one-time educational support for continuing her boarding school in order to not drop out of school. (Type A) Further help will be discussed by closer research with her family.

Theresia Kivamba and *Helena Petro* are living as well in the Masai culture. Both have a family and personal issues within and got empowered with Goats as Debora and Gladness. (Theresia 3 and Helena 2)

Zainabu Mrindoko was impowered with a clothes business. She is buying clothes at the main market and goes to resell them on different markets close to her village. With the income she can have enough money for her family's daily meals and basic needs.

Halima got the opportunity to try it with a pineapple business. We made a trial-month with her, which is costing us only a very few amount of 10'000 tsh. We were not sure if she is ready yet to get independent. She was depending for a very long time on her husband which treated her absolutely inhuman. Since she left after an argument which escalated, we hoped that she could grow mentally stronger and protect her own and her children's life. We were also looking forward to the day where she lets us help her with her youngest son (1,5 years) from whom she is hiding that he can't walk instead of reaching out for help. Unexpected she called us that she was pregnant and want to abort that child, it has no future-she said-and want to take it out, illegally. We discouraged her from this idea and went to the social welfare with this case. As well we promised that in case she would decide to keep the baby, we would make sure it

is well from the day on it will be born. Just 2 weeks ago she finally got it and what a wonder, her middle boy which has not walked until 2 years old walked finally!! A Bed and a mattress, some food and healthcare was provided to this family and we are looking forward to whats upcoming.

Zuhura Singano is a widow, left living with three children. They live in their own house and the children go to school. So that this can continue we supported Zuhura with a start-up business of selling fish. It should aim her to be able carrying all the finances which her husband provided before he has died.

Mwanahamisi has started selling clothes by walking around in her village, sending them to potential customers. She buys them by a huge market in town and sells them nearby her home. That job enables her to be close to her family with her many children and two small twins. As well it is a big help that she can contribute financially to the families income due to her husband's disability to work fully. He had an accident some years ago which makes it impossible for him to carry all the financial responsibility of the family alone. For now the family is able to cover all the basic needs and hopefully by next year as well all educational fees of their children. Mwanasha, one of her older daughters got school fees payed and other school issues fixed from Kipepeo. (Type A)

Mwajabu Tabali has passed away just right after the solution on how to help her was figured out. She was HIV-positive, what finally took her life. She was a widow and her children are grown up, that's why our support stops here.

Magdalena Suka got help with the school fees for one of her children last year until she this year succeeded well with the clothes business which we gave her a micro-loan for, to start it. She is a wonderful Mama who took back her four children into her care after over 10 years not seeing them due that her ex-husband had prohibited every contact.

Biasha and her Husband could not take over the financial responsibility of their children yet, due to personal reasons. We are making sure, together with village leaders and their neighbours, that the children are safe at home. Kipepeo helped to get the birth certificates for their two children so that we could sign them up for going to school. As well we had to find a school with an integration program for kids which are delay for entering the school system. Schoolfees and materials got financed from Kipepeo as well until we find a way for Biasha to get financial independent. (Type A)

Ayubu is a child in our education program (Type B) we fully committed to cover all his school costs until he graduates. His dream is it to get a house constructor. He is attending the first year of training now, living at a boarding school and visiting his home only while holidays.

Emanuel Tarimo's father died. His mother is not able to carry the school costs of all the children. As well is Emanuel living apart from his main family, but staying at his aunt's home in order to attend the close by school where he will become a tour guide after graduation.

Hassani and his bloody sister *Rehema* are coming both of the Family of Mama Ally which we are connected to-since we started Kipepeo. Mama Ally is a single mama having 10 children, 8 of it living with her. Hassani got suspended from the regular school because his girlfriend got pregnant (Tanzanian law). We found a boarding school which he attended well in 2021. Rehema started with prostitution back home. That's the reason why also she was sent to a

boarding school. She performed well but got suspended from school after writing the exams because of unwanted behaviours. Luckily she got good results and with that she will might have a last chance to get education provided at another school.

With *Sophia Bashir, Zainabu Hassani, Amina Ramadan, Aziran Nassro, Sabina Mollel, Juliet Lucas* and their Families we are still in the process of finding a good solution on how to grow into a more valuable life in future.

Community:

Montessori day cares are an important source in order to educate the children. As well it enables the parents to work, while their children are at he day care. We supported the Church hold Montessori Day care in Natiro by providing chairs, tables and matrasses for their newly built location.

Events:

For the international parents day as well as the international family day we were holding an event to raise awareness about both of those topics, providing knowledge, a warm meal and music at Mwereni Primary School in Moshi.

Several more Events we have been invited we were participating in terms of action and finances. Two examples: For the International Day of the Girl child we have spoken in the Tanzanian Radio and went to schools to educate the Children. For the International AIDS Day we attended Meetings and participated at the activities which were hold.
